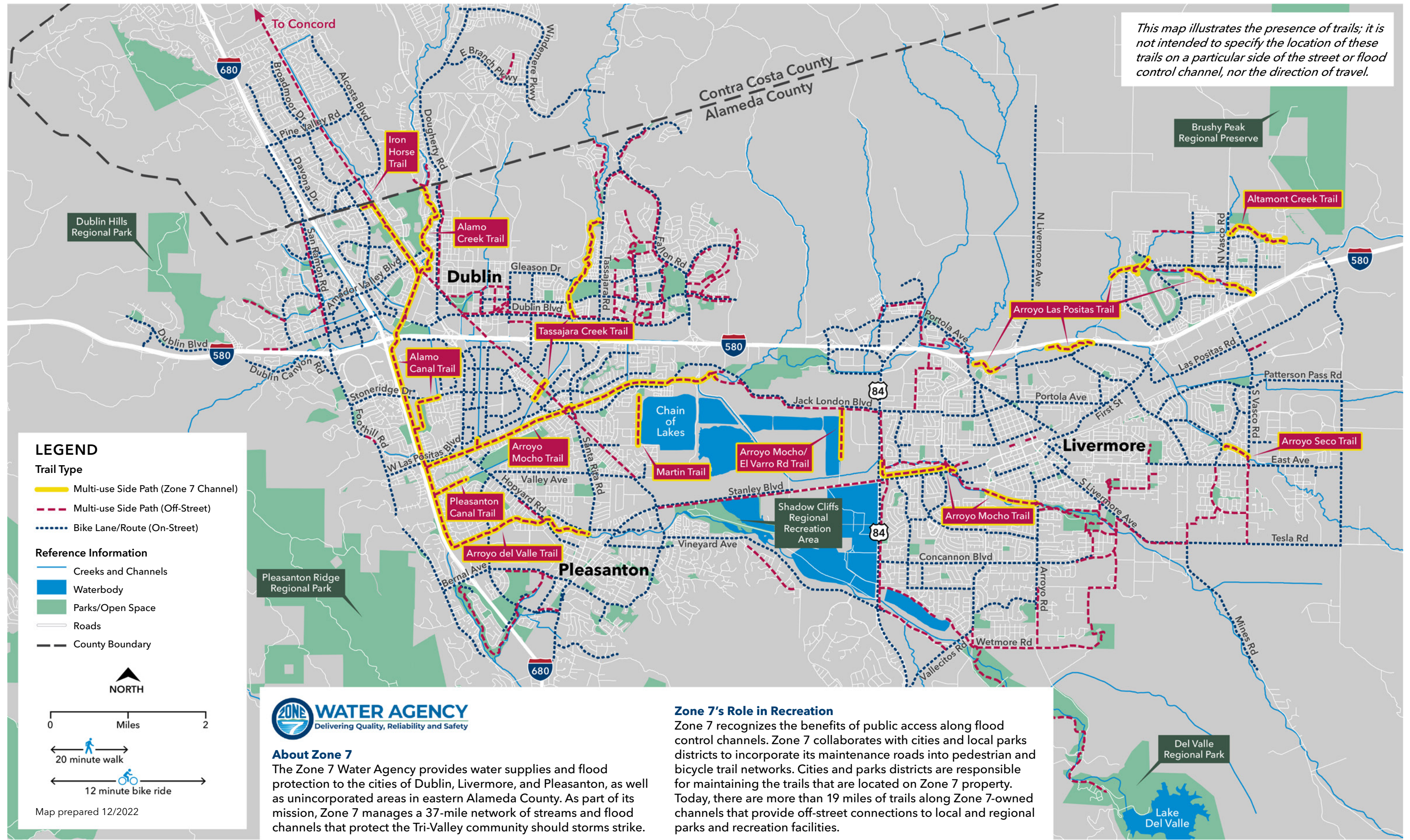


TRAILS AND RECREATION FACILITIES IN THE ZONE 7 SERVICE AREA

About Zone 7
 The Zone 7 Water Agency provides water supplies and flood protection to the cities of Dublin, Livermore, and Pleasanton, as well as unincorporated areas in eastern Alameda County. As part of its mission, Zone 7 manages a 37-mile network of streams and flood channels that protect the Tri-Valley community should storms strike.

Zone 7's Role in Recreation
 Zone 7 recognizes the benefits of public access along flood control channels. Zone 7 collaborates with cities and local parks districts to incorporate its maintenance roads into pedestrian and bicycle trail networks. Cities and parks districts are responsible for maintaining the trails that are located on Zone 7 property. Today, there are more than 19 miles of trails along Zone 7-owned channels that provide off-street connections to local and regional parks and recreation facilities.
