FIND LEAKS WITH FOOD COLORING!

Saving water is crucial during this historic drought! Toilet leaks waste valuable water. Here's a fun way to check for leaks using common household items.

WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

- A toilet (of course!)
- Food coloring drops (pick a color that is easily noticeable)
- Gloves (you don't want to dye your hands purple, do you?)
- An adult (remember to always have adult supervision for safety)

DID YOU KNOW?

Toilets account for the largest amount of indoor leaks. An undetected toilet leak could waste as much as 5 gallons of water per minute!



HOW TO CHECK:

1. Open the back tank of your toilet.
2. Add a few drops of food coloring into the tank.
3. Wait ten minutes (it seems like forever, I know).
4. Now check the bowl. If any color leaked into the bowl, then you have a leak!

Don't worry! Just replace your flapper and you're good to go!




LOOKING FOR LEAKS LABYRINTH

Hooray, you did it! Now Water-Wise Wendy can search around her home for leaks in outdoor faucets!






UNDER THE SINK SKETCHING

Looking for leaks isn't always easy. Sometimes you have to get down in low places to check it out! Check under all your sinks for signs of leaks. Pooling water and rust spots on pipes can be signs of leaks. Draw signs of leaks on and around the pipe below so you know what to look for in your home.

Leaking sprinkler systems waste SO much water (and money). That's why it's important to check for leaks regularly! Check for overspray and broken sprinkler heads. If you see that the cement is wet around your grass, adjust your sprinkler head for a closer spray. If your sprinkler looks like a big cloud of mist then adjust your water pressure - we don't waste around here!
