**ADVERTISEMENT FOR BIDS**

- 1. NOTICE.** The ALAMEDA COUNTY FLOOD CONTROL and WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT, acting by and through its ZONE 7 WATER AGENCY ("District") hereby gives notice that it will accept Bids for construction of the following public work:

OPERATED EQUIPMENT SUPPLY CONTRACT FOR MAINTENANCE  
AND EMERGENCY WORK FOR FLOOD CONTROL FACILITIES**

- 2. BID SUBMISSION.** District will receive sealed Bids no later than **2:00pm on Thursday, May 5th**, as determined by District staff by using [www.time.gov](http://www.time.gov). Due to Alameda County Health Orders for limiting the spread of COVID-19, the Bid Opening will take place virtually only by Zoom webinar. District will set up a Bid Box outside the front door at District's Main Office at 100 N. Canyons Parkway, Livermore, CA 94551. The Bid Box will be available to deposit bids starting at 12:30 pm on the day of the Bid Opening and will be removed promptly at 2:00pm. The Bid Box will be monitored by District staff. The Zoom webinar link for the Bid Opening will be posted on District's website ([www.zone7water.com](http://www.zone7water.com)) and may also be obtained by contacting the Project Manager by phone or email. Bids will be opened and read aloud at the virtual Zoom webinar. The Bid opening will be in accordance with procedures set forth in Document 00200 (Instructions to Bidders) and as modified in Document 00800 (Supplementary Conditions – Division 0).

- 4. DESCRIPTION OF THE WORK.** The Work consists of, the supply of fully operated and maintained construction equipment and the furnishing of labor and material to implement maintenance and emergency work on an as needed basis for flood control facilities including, but not limited to,

Operated Equipment Supply Contract for  
Maintenance and Emergency Work for  
Flood Control Facilities

- 1) removal of sediment;
- 2) installation of class II aggregate base and asphalt concrete on access roads and driveways;
- 3) installation of earthen or concrete V-ditches, drainage culverts and structures, drop inlets and pipes, outfall structures and
- 4) miscellaneous work as directed by the District Representative.

The District anticipates that the majority of the Work will be performed during work hours defined in Section 01100 (Summary of Work). However, the Contractor shall be available to perform District's Work on twenty-four hours per day/seven days per week (24/7) basis for emergency Work. When it is determined to be an emergency Work by the District Representative, Contractor must mobilize work force and equipment and respond to sites within two (2) hours of District notification, to perform the Work specified by District. For non-emergency Work, Contractor is required to mobilize and respond to District's request no more than two (2) calendar weeks upon notification. In order to facilitate a quick deployment of equipment and work force in an emergency, the District requires that the BIDDER shall have an operation yard located within a twenty-five (25) mile radius of the Zone 7 North Canyons Parkway office in Livermore. Failure to comply with this condition will result in disqualification of bids.

The contract is in the amount not to exceed \$1,200,000 per year. However, bid items may be greatly increased or decreased or reduced to zero. The increase or decrease of these amounts as compared with those set forth in the Document 00520 (Agreement) will not constitute a basis for claim by the Contractor for extra payment or damages or for anticipated profit. All work will be measured for payment on a time and material basis at the hourly rates and markup percentages set forth in the Document 00520 (Agreement).

**5. CONTRACT TIME.** The duration of the Contract shall be from July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2025. During this period, the Contractor shall be available to perform Work on an on-call basis as directed by the District Representative.

The contract may be extended for Two (2) additional one-year periods solely at the District's discretion. If the District extends the Contract for an additional one year period, the Contract Bonds and Insurance (Item 1), the unit prices from Items 2 through 17 for equipment and labor and Item 22 for All Work of Contract Documents other than Work separately provided for under other Bid items in the schedule of Bid Prices will be indexed to the most current Engineering News Record Construction Cost Index as published by McGraw Hill Publishing Company, in effect

at the time of contract extension. The indexing for each additional one-year period, if any, shall occur once on the first day of the extension, and will remain in effect for the remainder of each additional one-year period. The Construction Cost Index for April, 2022 shall be used as the base in comparison for updating the Bid prices for reimbursement purposes for the additional periods, if any.

- 6. REQUIRED CONTRACTOR'S LICENSE(S).** Each bidder is required to have a current **California Class A – General Engineering Contractor license** to bid this Contract. Joint ventures must secure a joint venture license prior to award of this Contract. Removal, handling, and/or disposal of hazardous materials may by law require hazardous substance removal certification by the Contractor's State License Board.

**PUBLIC WORKS CONTRACTOR REGISTRATION.** A contractor or subcontractor shall not be qualified to bid on, be listed in a bid proposal, subject to the requirement of Section 4104 of the Public Contract Code, or engage in the performance of any contract for public work, as defined in this chapter [1770-1784 Labor Code], unless currently registered and qualified to perform public work pursuant to Section 7029.1 of the Business and Professional Code or by Section 10164 or 20103.5 of the Public Contract Code, provided the contractor is registered to perform public work pursuant to Section 1725.5 at the time the contract is awarded.

- 7. PREVAILING WAGE LAWS.** The successful Bidder must comply with all prevailing wage laws applicable to the Project, and related requirements contained in the Contract Documents. Pursuant to applicable provisions of the Labor Code, the District has implemented and shall enforce a Labor Compliance Program (LCP) for the Work. The successful Bidder shall be required to comply with all the requirements of the District's LCP and applicable provisions of the California Labor Code. In bidding on the Work, it shall be each Bidder's responsibility to evaluate the cost of complying with the District's LCP. Bidders shall include all costs of compliance with specified requirements in their bids.

- 8. PROCUREMENT OF BIDDING DOCUMENTS.** Due to COVID-19, no bid documents are available at the District's offices for viewing or purchase. Bidding Documents are located online on the District's website at [www.zone7water.com](http://www.zone7water.com) where Bidders may download copies for no fee. Bidders must complete the web form to download plans and specs directly from the Zone 7 website to be put on the Planholders' List. Any addenda will be posted on the District's website and will be sent by email to those on the Planholders' List. If a Bidder fails to be put on the

Planholders' List as required, the District reserves the right to reject the Bid as non-responsive.

**9. BID PREPARATION COST.** Bidders are solely responsible for the cost of preparing their Bids.

**10. RESERVATION OF RIGHTS.** District specifically reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to reject any or all Bids, or re-bid, or to waive inconsequential deviations from Bid requirements not involving time, price, or quality of the Work.
