

- Non-Profit Mutual Benefit Corporation
- Membership open to all Contractors
- 27 of 29 Contractors represented
- Board of Directors (Zone 7 shares 1 seat with Alameda County WD and Valley Water)








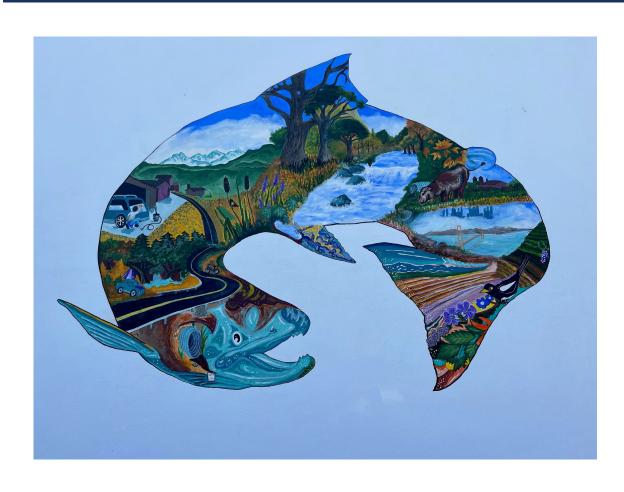
2021-22 Drought Year

WATER SUPPLY



- Federal ESA Biological Opinion Litigation and Reconsultation
- State ESA incidental take permit
- Voluntary Agreement Framework
 - Could resolve litigation issues
- Delta Conveyance
- Increased emphasis on San Joaquin River conditions
- Increased monitoring/science for south Delta operations

NEW ESA AND CESA PERMITS (RECONSULTATION)



- CVP/SWP proposed operations include the reduced Delta diversions proposed under the Voluntary Agreement
- Criteria for:
 - Cold water pool
 - Entrainment risk reduction
 - Monitoring and adaptive management
 - Mitigation actions
- Operations consistent between DWR and Reclamation proposals (Biological Assessment and ITP Application)
- Cost sharing consistent between CVP and SWP
- Total costs of ITP reduced by more than \$75M over 10-year permit


HEALTHY RIVERS AND LANDSCAPES

- SWB is Updating the Bay-Delta Water Quality Control Plan
- Governor and Water Agency have proposed Healthy Rivers and Landscapes
- SWB is currently in CEQA process
- Information development by VA parties
 - Science program
 - Legal agreements
 - Accounting mechanism
 - Governance document
- Integration with Phase I VA parties
- Tribal and NGO engagement



DELTA CONVEYANCE PROJECT

- CEQA litigation
- Water rights change in point of diversion
- Settlement agreements
- ESA/CESA permits
- Delta Stewardship Council consistency determination
- Continued project design



2023 HIGHLIGHTS

- Worked with DWR for the first time to apply for a Department of Energy Grant
- Implemented a science solicitation
- Hosted two science symposia on Tidal Wetlands Restoration and Floodplain
- Annual Financial Management Conference
- SWC had training on financial issues and put together the SharePoint to have materials available to the Contractors
- Advanced rate management credit and surplus revenue calculations
- Updated 10-year Energy Forecast Model
- Resolved over \$500M of cost share issues from the Sisk Dam
- Addressed threats from 3 water rights bills
- Contract Extension implementation is well underway and ready to go

- Voluntary Agreement CEQA document was released in September
- The permit applications for our Long-term Operations and Voluntary Agreement were submitted in November
- Secured the Voluntary Agreement funding
- Had successful legislative briefings, lunches, and tours that were well attended
- SWC planned two Board meeting field trips, one to San Luis Reservoir and the other to Oroville
- The final EIR for DCP was released
- The 10th Tolling Agreement was signed, and 72 protest items were resolved this year
- Adaptively managed Delta operations during 2023 storms
- 31 atmospheric rivers in 2023!!
